In reading about our Sisters who are of what others would call retirement age, you have been introduced to the many ways in which our Sisters minister to those who are in need of friendship, spiritual help, etc. Many of our Sisters will tell you that they are not bored and hope to continue ministering to God's people for as long as they can. One of our Sisters, Madeleine LaMarre, CND (S. Madeleine of Mary), had a phone ministry in the Kankakee area for many years and is well known for her charity to those in need.

Two of our Sisters in Warwick, RI explained that they were delayed in sending information for this article because they were quite busy doing the things they were writing about! Sr. Marie Cafferty, CND (S. Edward of Mary) and Sr. Rita McGetrick, CND (S. Rita Maureen) are Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors. At the West Bay Manor, they conduct a Eucharistic Prayer Service; they also visit with homebound people, praying with them and bringing them Eucharist. Sr. Marie visits a friend who is in a nursing home and has no family. She does her laundry and brings her homemade goodies. Sr. Rita puts her business and computer skills to work in taking care of the business needs of several people. She follows and pays the bills and balances bank statements. These sisters also share in the household tasks and they are avid sports fans for the Red Sox and Patriots!

Also living with Sr. Marie and Sr. Rita is Sr. Simonne Camire, CND (S. Clement and Rose serving as a Lector and Eucharistic Minister on a regular basis. Sr. Simonne has various responsibilities in overseeing the upkeep of our summer home in Rhode Island. She also meets graduates of St. Mary of the Visitation who express their gratitude for the fine education they received from the CNDs.

Liberating Education develops aptitudes needed for the transformation of our times: inclusivity; openness to what is other/different; communion with the sacred; the practice of non-violence; solidarity with the oppressed, hope in the Gospel of love.

#### St. Jean Baptiste High School

Rooted in the inclusive vision of Marguerite Bourgeoys, St. Jean's provides a liberating college preparatory education to young women of diverse strengths and backgrounds. SJB's Mission is boldly expressed in its Profile of the SJB Graduate – she is: A Woman of Personal Strength and Courage; A Woman of Faith; A Woman of Academic Achievement; A Woman for Others; A Woman Oriented to the Future.

To meet the challenges of the graduate profile SJB is conducting a significant renovation and expanding the school's facilities. The school's attention to the future led to its participation in a Title II D Grant Project: Enhancing Education Through Technology. SJB teachers and students will partner with two Manhattan public schools in creating model 21st century high schools. This inquiry based learning experience involves robotics, digital documentaries, and a research project focusing on water resources.

#### Villa Maria Academy

The VMA Mission is to provide a foundation in Liberating Education within a nurturing Catholic Community. The mission permeates the VMA environment, programs and curriculum. It is as contagious as the children and faculty prayer, celebrations and rituals, e.g. Inter-

national Day of Peace, Advent Service Project to feed the hungry (*International Heifer Program*), the Annual Earth Day Parade. Given the devastating fire of 2000, the Villa's vitality is simply remarkable. Immediate and sustained support from every part of VMA's educational and extended family empowered the VMA to come back stronger than ever. The renovated main building and beautiful new additions of Mary's Way and Visitation Activities Center testify to the enduring strength and magnetism of the Mission.

#### **Notre Dame Academy**

Notre Dame is one of the few Pre-K - 12th grade catholic schools for girls in the country. NDA's Mission is to excel at Liberating Education empowering each girl and young woman to become an agent of her own transformation and the transformation of society. To fulfill this mission promise in 2006, NDA embarked on an Expansion for Excellence Plan and Capital Campaign. The generosity of donors, CND support and the Academy's community has made the expansion a reality. A new Early Childhood Education Center, Pre K through 2nd grade, opened in the fall of 2008. The Arts, Humanities and Chapel building, for Grades 6-12 will open this fall. Less visible but no less palpable are the many new collaborators that have come to experience the hope and challenge of the vision and mission of Marguerite Bourgeoys.

#### **CND Centers for Mission**

The revitalization of our CND sponsored schools provides us with new opportunities. The schools' geographic proximity has allowed for collaboration that can only grow. The schools can also become Centers for Mission Outreach. ## A Journey to Scranton, PA

n the heart of Northeast Pennsylvania, the city of Scranton nestles in a valley of the Endless Mountains. Rich in history and heritage—railroads, mining, and the silk industry—but economically depressed, the "Electric City" is home for two of our CND sisters. Sr. Mary Anne Foley, CND, has taught theology at the University of Scranton for 18 years, while Sr. Ann Perrin, CND, a family therapist and educator, has worked in a number of venues in Scranton for 8 years. They live in a University house surrounded by many students, part of a project to encourage students and faculty and staff to live in neighborhoods together. Having extra bedrooms was a bonus for Sr. Mary Anne and Sr. Ann because they wanted their home to be a place for visitation. CNDs, young women working for political candidates, a Visitation Volunteer, stranded travelers, etc. have stayed with the Sisters over the years. Their home has become a gathering place for meals, discussions, prayer and even board games!

In her time at the University, Sr. Mary Anne has created theology courses which have been enriching and thought-provoking for the students, including God & the Earth and 20th Century Peacemakers. In addition to teaching theology, a heroic feat in itself, she is also the Coordinator of Education for Justice for the University. Immigration was the theme for this past school year, and Sr. Mary Anne coordinated a manyfaceted approach to the topic, including national and local speakers, an immigration mosaic of ancestors of students, faculty and staff, a day-long teach-in, etc. At the end of the year, no one looked at immigration in the same way they had in the beginning.

Last year, Sr. Mary Anne joined colleagues in an immersion experience in El Salvador (with a side trip to visit our Sisters in Guatemala), and this year she chap-

eroned a students' service trip to Ecuador. She also has international experience right in Scranton as she teaches English to Sonia, a woman from Bulgaria, who is director of the Catholic Social Services Refugee Program and a recently naturalized citizen of the United States. In between these activities, she has completed a book on Visitation Spirituality which should be published in the next few months.

Sr. Ann is a licensed Marriage and Family therapist and educator. One of the reasons she felt called to Scranton was the fact that there were only two family therapists in this geographic area. Sr. Ann is an adjunct professor in the Graduate Counseling Department of the University of Scranton, teaching and supervising future community, rehab and school counselors. She looks forward to teaching in the new Marriage and Family therapy track that the Counseling Department is planning to add.

For seven years, Sr. Ann worked at Catholic Social Services, where she counseled families of the working poor and provided supervision for counseling interns. In the fall of 2009, she will be able once again to counsel families suffering in this poor economic climate, this time on a part-time basis from an office space in the downtown area of Scranton. In addition, she has offered to provide counseling for one family at the University's Lehy Family Center, which provides free medical and emotional help to the community of the Scranton area who do not have health insurance.

While working at a local Catholic school, Sr. Ann created a Peace Makers program for elementary school students and college mentors. It is a 6-week program which incorporates peace with the body, the earth, one another and the world. University students have participated as part of their service learning. The program, which is housed in the Leahy Family Center, is now part of the University curriculum for the Graduate School Counseling Practicum, and children from the Center's multicultural families have begun to take part. Begun with grant money from the CND community, Peace Makers has taken on a life of its own. It has been used in Kankakee, Providence, New Jersey and New York; in summer camps, CCD and parish programs. Sr. Ann is in the process of having the program published

so it can be used even more widely.

Once a month, Sr. Ann facilitates a group focused on the relationships and healthy communication for women who are a part of the Women and Infants Residential Program run by the IHM Sisters. This past year, she taught the Enneagram to 40 faculty, staff and maintenance persons as part of the Wellness Program at the University. Everyone is looking

## "Come and See"

In the past year, at least one hundred thirty-one women made inquiries about entrance to the Congregation of Notre Dame. These women, with their questions, come from all over the United States and Canada. By using a "vocation-match" service, available to all religious communities through *Vision* vocation magazine, the seekers arrive via the internet!

Sr. Lucille Cormier (S. Jeanne of the Redeemer) and Sr. Peggy Doyle, vocation directors in Blessed Sacrament province, are particularly fond of this internet component of their responsibilities. "It's the surprise element," says Sr. Lucille, "You never know on what day you'll open your email and find a beautiful profile of someone who is asking for help in discerning God's direction in her life. The profiles usually reveal that the person is quite serious in her search." The survey then functions as the beginning of a conversation about religious life in the CND.

Although vast in scope, the internet, of course, is not the only path to religious life today. Technology-savvy women also inquire in more traditional ways, a letter, a phone call, direct contact with a sister. By far, the traditional path is the one preferred by recent Blessed Sacrament Province new members. Once an initial connection is made with the vocation office, Sr. Peggy and Sr. Lucille are eager to be of help.

In this first decade of the 21st century, a significant part of being helpful CND vocation directors involves introducing a candidate to the international character of the Congregation. The CND has always been glad for the breadth of its reach in ministry beyond North America. But in the last few years, the Congregation's Vocation Committee has worked deliberately to "name and claim our internationality." (Visitation Beyond Borders, Chapter document 2006-2011, p.5) for new members. The committee comprises members from Central America, Japan, Cameroon, France, United States and Canada. When the group gets together, there is the joy of multi-lingual sisterhood and all members are challenged to work hard at learning one or two new languages.

Languages are a challenge for Vocation Committee members, but their enthusiasm about preparing new members to own the community's "international collective voice for justice, peace, and the protection of creation" is unbounded. Vocation committee meetings mean lots of sharing of materials and ideas that can be used throughout the Congregation. The international bonding is amazing.

Amazing too is the overall ministry of Vocation Director. It is the opportunity to accompany a woman who wants to "come and see" (John 1:39) if God is calling her to a new way of following Jesus in religious life. Young seekers are often looking for community life, shared prayer, service to the poor, and relationship to the Church. They want to be active in the world, to
