ur retired Sisters – those who can — stay in motion. For 42 years, Sr. Alyn Larson, CND, served in education, mainly high school social studies teaching. In 2014, she decided to retire. Since that time she has volunteered at St. Jean Baptiste High School in Manhattan. The CNDs cherish this school. Many Sisters are graduates and the CNDs have been its administrators for decades.

Sr. Alyn has become essential to St. Jean's administrative and advancement offices. She helps the Advancement Director maintain the school database, and she researches and organizes materials the school sends out. It doesn't stop there.

Sr. Alyn assists with major events, such as the annual Alumnae Reunion and the Registration Night for incoming students.

On top of all this, Sr. Alyn helps on the province level. She's the proofreader of the province newsletter and keeper of the province archives. She drives to province headquarters in Wilton, CT periodically to organize the treasure trove of pictures and documents that makes up the archives.

Helping Prisoners Start Over - Thanks to You!

hat does this test mean to you?" That's what Sr. Bea Baker, CND, asks when her pupils sit for their GED exams. Sr. Bea is a member of an interfaith group that teaches inmates at the Will County Jail in Joliet, IL. These are prisoners who have been arrested and are waiting to be arraigned by the court.

"Passing the test and receiving their GED is a huge accomplishment for these men and women," Sr. Bea says. "It opens the door to a whole new world."

Sr. Bea says many of the inmates hadn't valued education. Some are addicts who began using drugs as teens. School was never a priority. Some suffer from mental illness.

They are on medication just to keep stable and calm. Some came from difficult homes and have been in trouble most of their lives. They were kicked out of school or dropped out. "Now there's an awakening. They care about education. They realize the importance and value of it."

"We meet the inmates for only a short while. We hope and pray it's a moment when they're open to change so they can start fresh."

Sr. Bea has been teaching at the prison for ten years. She earns a small salary. She says her work with prisoners fulfills the CND mission of solidarity with the marginalized.

"It's the ministry that matches my gifts the most. It's a privilege. Society



sees criminals. I see their good side and potential. It's beautiful to work with the interfaith team and bring a little bit of hope and kindness to a place that doesn't have much of either."

The team is not there to evangelize or convert the inmates to any religion. "We respect the God in each person. We trust that the God in each person is the healer and life giver."

Thanks to your generosity, Sr. Bea can continue bringing hope and kindness to prisoners and inspiring them to begin their lives anew.


