🐧 r. Melba Rosa Vásquez Rodríguez, CND, is serving as Pastoral Associate and Director of Religious Education at St. Aloysius Parish in Harlem. A CND for 27 years, Sr. Melba is a member of Our Lady of Guadalupe Region, based in Tegucigalpa, Honduras.

Sr. Melba asked to serve in Blessed Sacrament Province (U.S.) in order to experience the multicultural character and internationality of the CND. She also wanted to share the mission and life of the province's sisters and associates. She lives with eight sisters at St. Columba Convent in lower Manhattan.

St. Aloysius Parish is an international community unto itself, made up of English-speaking, Spanish-speaking and Frenchspeaking parishioners. "To live our faith," Sr. Melba says, "language doesn't matter. To develop a community, to be aware of social issues and the many nationalities here in the parish – that is the challenge.

A CND Associate Ministers at the Border


