Receiving Care in a Different Facility – An Opportunity to Share Faith

In Dec. 2019, CND Sisters needing skilled nursing care began receiving it in a new facility. For over 20 years, they had received such care at a health center run by the School Sisters of Notre Dame in Wilton, CT. The facility was closed and all the Sisters had to be relocated.

After a long search, the CNDs chose Jewish Senior Services (JSS) in Bridgeport, CT. JSS has the advantage of being up the street from Executive House Aparments, where eight CNDs now live. The Sisters can easily visit* and minister as CNDs to one another.

Sr. Kathleen Fitz Simons, CND, was the first Sister to move to JSS. Before falling ill in Nov. 2017, she was CND local leader at Andrus on Hudson, NY, a senior care community. For many years she held administrative positions in and for Catholic schools in several Archdioceses.

Sr. Kathleen says that even while living at JSS she can convey CND spirituality. She does this "by being who I am every day – welcoming and reaching out to people. The mission is in who we are – living the Visitation and Pentecost spirit."

She talks to the nurses and aides who ask her about her pictures of the Visitation. She receives visits from the CNDs at Executive House. "The more that the staff meet the Sisters who are visiting, the more conversations that take place. If people feel comfortable to ask questions, that's an opportunity to share faith."

Jewish Senior Services welcomes all regardless of religion. Mass is offered every Friday and in anticipation of major feast days and holy days.

Well-Prepared to Be the New Justice and Peace Coordinator

or decades, Sr. Jaculyn Hanrahan, CND, served the vulnerable and exploited in Appalachia. That experience is proving useful for her new position. In July 2019 she became Blessed Sacrament Province's new Justice and Peace Coordinator.

Sr. Jackie joined the Congregation in 1969. She taught high school

English and religion for a while but felt something was missing. She found herself reflecting on the Congregation's call to work directly with the poor. On a visit to Appalachia for her students, a principal in Hurley, VA offered her a job. She took it and stayed in Appalachia for 37 years.

The move to a small rural area turned Sr. Jackie's life around. She saw that the residents had no representation in legal disputes. So, she set about earning a law degree from the University of Virginia in 1996.

Sr. Jackie was then able to provide legal remedies for the environmental costs of coal mining. In 2011 she helped launch the Appalachian Faith and Ecology Center. Its goal is to inspire care for the unique ecology of Central Appalachia. The mountains there are the oldest in the world.

Moreover, this area has the highest biodiversity in the continental U.S.

When Sr. Jackie heard the position of Justice and Peace Coordinator was open, she felt a familiar pull. It was "the same pull as when I thought about studying law." She saw an opportunity to help the CNDs re-connect to their rootedness in gospel justice. How can aging CNDs do this, she asks, "in a way that is integrated into their living fully and well?"

Sr. Jackie describes her new post as a call that "resonates from within. I am responding and trusting it will work – God is everywhere I am."

Legacy Society Members on Staying Connected to the CNDs


