## Serving as a Hospital Chaplain during the Pandemic

e are all familiar with the small receptacle of blessed water just inside the entrance to a Catholic church. Perhaps now more out of habit than symbolic gesture, we dip our fingers into the blessed water and make the Sign of the Cross, a symbol of our baptism and a mark of our discipleship in Christ. You may have noticed that this receptacle has been absent in these Covid-19 days.

I work as an on-call chaplain at Bridgeport Hospital in Bridgeport, CT. Habitual at the hospital is the hand cleansing "in/out practice" when we enter and leave a patient's room. One day recently, a nurse suggested I visit Mr. C., a gentle and sometimes 'confused' fellow. I cleansed my hands before going into his room and slowly approached his bed. He appeared to be asleep, the blanket covering almost all of his face, but when I softly called his name, he was immediately present. I was not prepared for what happened next. As soon as I introduced myself as a chaplain, his hands literally "flew

out" from under the covers and he grasped both of my ungloved hands. He then proceeded to pray aloud for the sick, their caregivers, for peace, for himself, for me and much more. At the "Amen" he released my hands.

I was momentarily speechless; moved by Mr. C's simple vet profound faith. Who was the spiritual caregiver here? I confess that I also was distracted by his grasp of my hands. At that point, and in the weeks since March 13, 2020, I hadn't touched or been touched by anyone, not shaken any hands, given any reassuring hugs. And now this stranger held my unprotected hands. What had transpired in the months since March 13, 2020? How was it that this "new normal" had me rethinking even the most ordinary and frequently used spiritual-care gesture of holding a patient's hand? Considering it in a whole new light, that of "communicable" disease rather than "communion" of care? But there it was

When I left him. I went to the hand-sanitizing station and thought, "I'm leaving a sacred space, a sanctu-

ary." My own prayer in that moment became "Give me the grace to let it be," and it was answered; my "cleanse out" gesture transformed as I instinctively made the Sign of the Cross. I had been blessed.


