Bridging Hearts and Cultures: CND Sisters' Legacy at Red Cloud Indian School

For several decades, three CND Sisters* devoted themselves to the Red Cloud Indian School on South Dakota's Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Sr. Margaret Giroux (*S. Patricia Marie*) taught art and engaged in development work for 32 years. Sr. Mary Jane Hebert (*S. David Maureen*) instilled lessons in religion to fifth through eighth graders for 26 years. Meanwhile, Sr. Anne Seeley shared her love of music for 12 years.

Coming from the busy streets of New York City, the Sisters found themselves in an utterly unfamiliar setting: the stark but tranquil landscape of the nation's poorest reservation. Yet the vast prairies and profound quiet enthralled them. Sr.Mary Jane discovered a unique connection with God, saying, "I learned to pray in ways I never had before. The reservation is a place of prayer, and its people are deeply

spiritual. The stillness allowed God's voice to find me more easily."

Sr. Anne was moved by the Native Americans' religious tolerance, noting, "There is one God, but we

come to that God through different paths. The Native Americans were not judgmental. I felt wholeheartedly embraced in any place I chose to pray."

Sr. Margaret was inspired by the remarkable artistry of the reservation's people, calling it "a reflection of their souls, a vital aspect of their identity. That's the role of art anywhere – it's a beautiful part of the soul – we all need that."

Over time, a profound bond formed between the CND Sisters and the Native American community. Sr. Mary Jane reflected, "We may not have been Lakota, but we became one with them." In turn, the Red Cloud students learned that they were cherished and valued for simply being themselves.



transitioned from life on the reservation to serving at Notre Dame Academy in Staten Island. Sr. Mary Jane contributes her wisdom and energy to the Finance and Mission Advancement offices. Sr. Margaret, at 102 years old (!), bakes bread for the Sisters and crochets afghans for school raffles. Sr. Anne serves as Campus Minister for the elementary and high schools.

Their lives have changed, but the Sisters cherish the memories and lessons from their service at Red Cloud. As Sr. Mary Jane puts it, "It was a beautiful experience. I missed it for a long time."

Dedication and Preservation: a Visit with Sr. Joann Compagno, Province Archivist

S r. Joann Compagno recently celebrated 60 years as a Congrégation de Notre Dame Sister. Technically, she's retired, although, as she notes, "Nuns never retire." One of her responsibilities has been to serve, since 2021, as the archivist for Blessed Sacrament (U.S.) province. She says that another role, helping elderly Sisters move into new quarters, prepared her: "I was called the closer and opener. In evaluating people's effects, I learned to view them as archival material and to take care deciding what to save and what to discard."

Sr. Joann also played a role in the closure of the province office at Wilton, CT in 2020. Almost everything from the large archive - written materials, pictures, and artifacts - was sent to the congregation's headquarters in Montreal. "It was like taking

a deep dive into history and into beauty. I got a taste of the enjoyment that could come from doing this work." Sr. Joann points out that an archivist is not at her desk all the time – she's engaged with people. An important part of her job is to listen. She says that just sitting down with the Sisters taught her more about CND ministries than she could have imagined.

Sr. Joann has embraced her new position. "Being able to put my hand on something that reflects a person, a Sister, a school, the powerhouse that we have as CNDs in our history and in our present ministries – that's what fills you as an archivist. You see the gifts over the years – the day-to-day life of Sisters and what they were able to achieve."

Sr. Nancy Roach, CND - Is a New Form of Religious Life Emerging?

n 1979, Sr. Nancy Roach (*S. Daniel-des-Anges*), CND had a wonderful idea: why not create an Associate Relationship for the Congrégation de Notre Dame? The plan was to invite lay women and men to embrace the spiritual teachings of CND foundress St. Marguerite Bourgeoys. The CND General Council approved this innovative concept, and in 1981, the very first Associate, hailing from French Canada, made her First Commitment.

Little did they know that this humble beginning would grow into a worldwide movement. As Sr. Nancy puts it, "We started with just two Associates, and now it's a one-to-one partnership with a CND Sister." Sr. Nancy sees the success of the Associate Relationship as a sign of new life in the Church.

A Sister since 1953, Sr. Nancy has dedicated 70 years to CND service, with 33 of those spent in Central America and Canada. Her journey included training as a


