


# "There was a yearning in me for community..."

r. Suzanne Poulin, CND is nearing her 90th birthday. For 70 of those years, she has served as a Sister of the Congrégation de Notre Dame (CND).

She first met the CND's while attending a Vermont school where they taught. At 18, she joined the Congregation and began her ministry in education. After a number of years, she felt called to chaplaincy. She earned a Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) certificate and served as a Pastoral Care Director at several facilities in New York and Connecticut, including residences for elderly CND Sisters.

Sr. Suzanne retired at 80 and was among the first to establish the new CND community at Executive House in Bridgeport, CT.\* Never one to stay idle, she became a hospice volunteer at a nearby senior care facility. After a few falls, she now focuses on visiting other Executive House residents, often starting conversations in the elevators. "I still do that," she says. "People hadn't met many nuns before, so I had to explain why we don't wear a habit. Now, people are very friendly."

As she puts it, "Visitations can happen all the time in our lives. We meet so many people. You see Mary and Jesus in the people who are part of your life."

Thanks to you, Sr. Suzanne continues her elevator apostolate, where she charms everyone she meets.

r. Janet Lawrence felt chosen. Raised Jewish, she was drawn to Catholicism and completed the RCIA program at St. Mary Parish in Ridgefield, CT. She was baptized, confirmed, and received the Eucharist there. In 2008, she began her journey with the CND, starting as a novice and ultimately making her final vows on Nov. 23, 2019.

Although initially trained as a neonatal nurse practitioner, Sr. Janet found a different calling. She pursued a master's degree in pastoral studies, earned board

certification as a chaplain, and now ministers at St. Vincent Hospital in Bridgeport, CT.






Sr. Janet spends her days connecting with as many patients as possible. In the CND spirit of visitation, she extends Christ's love to all, no matter their background. "I see many people, including those struggling with addiction, and even prisoners in restraints. I don't judge them. I talk to each one as a person, saying, 'We are sister and brother to each other. Because Jesus loves you, I love you.' They often reply, 'I love you, too.'"

"The hospital is my church," she says. "It's where I come to be with God's vulnerable, His beloved children who need to know they are loved."
